PALM SUNDAY – PASSION SUNDAY

Dear Friends,

I offer you this homily by Saint Melito of Sardis for your reflection during this Holy Week. St. Melito was a bishop who died in 180 A.D. The riches buried deep in the treasure chest of the Church's enduring history are fascinating and a source of consolation. That's why I repeat over and over just how important it is that we remain connected to our history and traditions.

THE LAMB THAT WAS SLAIN HAS DELIVERED US FROM DEATH AND GIVEN US LIFE.

There was much proclaimed by the prophets about the mystery of the Passover: that mystery is Christ, and to him be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

For the sake of suffering humanity he came down from heaven to earth, clothed himself in that humanity in the Virgin's womb, and was born a man. Having then a body capable of suffering, he took the pain of fallen man upon himself; he triumphed over the diseases of soul and body that were its cause, and by his Spirit, which was incapable of dying, he dealt man's destroyer, death, a fatal blow.

He was led forth like a lamb, he was slaughtered like a sheep. He ransomed us from our servitude to the world, as he has ransomed Israel from the land of Egypt; he freed us from our slavery to the devil, as he had freed Israel from the hand of Pharaoh. He sealed our souls with his own Spirit, and the members of our body with his own blood.

He is the One who covered death with shame and cast the devil into mourning, as Moses cast Pharaoh into mourning. He is the one who brought us out of slavery into freedom, out of darkness into light, out of death into life, out of tyranny into an eternal kingdom; who made us a new priesthood, a people chosen to be his own forever. He is the Passover that is our salvation.

It is he who endured every kind of suffering in all those who foreshadowed him. In Abel he was slain, in Isaac bound, in Jacob exiled, in Joseph sold, in Moses exposed to die. He was sacrificed in the Passover Lamb, persecuted in David, dishonored in the prophets.

It is he who was made man of the Virgin, he who was hung on the tree, it is he who was buried in the earth, raised from the dead, and taken up to the heights of heaven. He is the mute lamb, the slain lamb, the lamb born of Mary, the fair ewe. He was seized from the flock, dragged off to be slaughtered, sacrificed in the evening, and buried at night. On the tree no bone of his was broken, in the earth his body knew no decay. He is the One who rose from the dead, and who raised man from the depths of the tomb.

Por eso les repito constantemente sobre la importancia de mantenernos ligados a nuestra historia y tradiciones.

EL CORDERO INMOLADO NOS HA HECHO PASAR DE LA MUERTE A LA VIDA

Los profetas predijeron muchas cosas sobre el misterio pascual, que es el mismo Cristo, al cual sea la gloria por los siglos de los siglos. Amén.

Él vino del cielo a la tierra para remediar los sufrimientos del hombre; se hizo hombre en el seno de la Virgen, y de ella nació como hombre, cargó con los sufrimientos del hombre, mediante su cuerpo, sujeto al dolor, y destruyó los padecimientos de la carne, y él, que era inmortal por el Espíritu, destruyó el poder de la muerte que nos tenía bajo su dominio.

Él fue llevado como una oveja y muerto como un cordero; nos redimió de la seducción del mundo, como antaño de Egipto, y de la esclavitud del demonio, como antaño del poder del Faraón; selló nuestras almas con su Espíritu y los miembros de nuestro cuerpo con su sangre.

Él, aceptando la muerte, sumergió en la derrota a Satanás, como Moisés al Faraón. Él castiga la iniquidad y la injusticia, del mismo modo que Moisés castigó a Egipto con la esterilidad.

Él nos ha hecho pasar de la esclavitud a la libertad, de las tinieblas a la luz, de la muerte a la vida, de la tiranía al reino eterno, y ha hecho de nosotros un sacerdocio nuevo, un pueblo elegido, eterno. Él es la Pascua de nuestra salvación.

Él es quien sufría tantas penalidades en la persona de muchos otros: Él es quien fue muerto en la persona de Abel y atado en la persona de Isaac, él anduvo peregrino en la persona de Jacob y fue vendido en la persona de José, él fue expósito en la persona de Moisés, degollado en el cordero pascual, perseguido en la persona de David y vilipendiado en la persona de los profetas.

Él se encarnó en el seno de la Virgen, fue colgado en el madero, sepultado bajo tierra y, resucitado de entre los muertos, subió a lo más alto de los cielos.

Este es el cordero que permanecía mudo y que fue inmolado; este es el que nació de María; la blanca oveja; este es el que fue tomado de entre la grey y arrastrado al matadero, inmolado al atardecer y sepultado por la noche; este es aquel cuyos huesos no fueron quebrados sobre el madero y que en la tumba no experimentó la corrupción; este es el que resucitó de entre los muertos y resucitó al hombre desde las profundidades del sepulcro.

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Rite of the Church - binding on Roman Catholics from the age of 14 and older. (USCCB)

HOW WE PRAY AT ST. STANISLAUS KOSTKA

WE KEEP OUR DOORS OPEN ALL DAY AND ALL NIGHT:

We listen. In response to the call of the Blessed Virgin Mary we strive to create quiet refuge from the labor of life's journey where the soul is opened to the transforming power of God's ever abiding presence. The grace of the *Holy Eucharist* will assist a covenant people on its return to childlike trust in Jesus, provide healing and strength, and inspire enthusiasm for the work of life. Therefore we wish to safeguard sacred silence in this sanctuary that God's voice is heard in the deep recesses of the soul.

WE OFFER THE SACRED MYSTERIES AD ORIENTEM:

The *Sacred Mysteries* are offered as they were for nearly 2000 years. Today, while the *ordinary form* for offering the *Holy Eucharist* has the priest facing the *sacred assembly*, here we follow an ancient form of the *Holy Offering*, the priest and the people together, raising their eyes to the *East* from where the Lord will come at the end of all things.

This option for offering the *Sacred Mysteries* was nearly universally eclipsed in the aftermath of the Second Vatican Council beginning in the mid-1960s, but Pope Benedict, Cardinal Sarah, and other Church Fathers have inspired a resurgence of this ancient gesture for offering the *Liturgy of the Holy Eucharist*.

At the *Altar of Sacrifice*, the *priest* lays down his life and the *sacred assembly* does likewise. This is our mutual *fiat* – our *yes* spoken and offered in thanksgiving that the Lord receive us as a people in need of redemption. The Lord indeed comes to us with redeeming grace. Together, priest and people offer themselves in Christ and through Christ to the Father. Ours is a plea that God make all things new and keep us on the narrow, but difficult path that serves humanity even as it carries us to the homeland. Our turning *Ad Orientem* facilitates a proper response to having been fed with the *Word of God* as well as an appropriate preparation for the *Supper of the Lamb*.

WE OFFER TWO OPTIONS FOR THE RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION:

After the Second Vatican Council, standing for reception of the *Holy Eucharist* became the norm and fits the directives of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. Nonetheless, kneeling to receive Jesus in *Holy Communion* is in keeping with the enduring tradition of our ancestors. Today the option to kneel or stand rests with the individual. Likewise, the option to receive the *Holy Eucharist* on the tongue or on the hand rests with the individual.

Whichever manner we choose to receive Jesus in the *Holy Eucharist*, let us be conscious of this sacred and life sustaining encounter. Let us receive Him in grace and with gratitude, humbly and in humility.
