LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

CORPUS CHRISTI

Dear Friends,

Today the Church celebrates the Feast of Corpus Christi. It's quite appropriate that after the Easter Season the Church in her wisdom celebrates, first the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity followed by the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, or as called traditionally, the Feast of Corpus Christi.

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is also called Holy Communion, the Holy Eucharist, the Blessed Sacrament, and the Divine Mysteries, in addition to other pronouns. I often refer to these Sacred Mysteries of our faith as the Eucharistic Gift or the "Hidden Manna." The term "Hidden Manna" comes from the last book of the Bible – the Book of Revelations, chapter 2:17. The term hearkens back to Psalm 78, recalling how God sustained the Israelites in their desert journey to the Promised Land: "God rained manna upon them for food; bread from heaven He gave them." This was a preparation for the full revelation of God in history. The Incarnate God, that is, God in the Flesh – Jesus Christ – would offer Himself as food for the journey. This unique presence of Jesus is now hidden under the guise of bread and wine which is "Emmanuel," meaning God with us.

God is with us under the appearance of bread and wine to sustain us, to change us, and to empower us! He is the "Hidden Manna" – Bread for the journey that we not collapse as we go on our way towards the Promised Land – God's Kingdom – The Heavenly Jerusalem. Not only does He sustain us, but He empowers us to be ever active in the mission of the Church. What is the mission? The mission is to make Christ present in the world. In other words, in the Hidden Manna we literally receive Jesus in His Eucharistic presence, and we do so in order to become what we consume. We should be open to the change the Lord wishes to effect in our lives. The goal is to say with St. Paul, "It is no longer I who live, but Christ Jesus who lives in me."

The Church calls us to awaken from slumber and to turn our attention to the hidden and sublime mysteries of our faith. This is a call to be a truly Eucharistic people. As we approach the Eucharistic Gift we are conscious of our adoption as sons and daughters of God the Father, and brothers and sisters of God the Son. By the power of the Holy Spirit ever active in the life of the Church, which is the Mystical Body of Christ, we adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, we receive Jesus in Holy Communion, and we become true disciples conformed to the image of Him who we receive. The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is in a word, our life.

Be inspired by these words written in the first century of the Church, 1,900 years ago, by St. Justin Martyr: "This food we call Eucharist, of which no one is allowed to partake except one who believes that the things we teach are true, and has received the washing of forgiveness of sins for rebirth, and who lives as Christ taught us. For we do not receive these things as common bread or common drink, but as Jesus Christ our Savior who became incarnate by God's word and took flesh and blood for our salvation. The food consecrated by the word of prayer, from which our flesh and blood are nourished and renewed, *is* the flesh and blood of the incarnate Jesus."

CARTA DEL PÁRROCO

CORPUS CHRISTI

Estimados Amigos,

Hoy la Iglesia celebra la Solemnidad de Corpus Christi. Es muy propio que después de la Temporada de la Pascua la Iglesia en su sabiduría celebra, primero la Solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad, seguido por la Solemnidad del Cuerpo y Sangre de Jesucristo, o tradicionalmente llamado, la Solemnidad de Corpus Christi.

El Sagrado Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo es también llamado la Sagrada Comunión, la Sagrada Eucaristía, el Santísimo Sacramento, y los Misterios Divinos, y otros pronombres. A menudo me refiero a estos Misterios Sagrados de nuestra fe como el Don Eucarístico o el “Maná Oculto” que viene del último libro de la Biblia – el Libro de la Apocalipsis, capítulo 2:17. El término viene del Salmo 78, recordando cómo Dios sostuvo a los Israelitas en su jornada por el desierto hacia la Tierra Prometida: “Dios les mando la lluvia del maná como alimento; les dio el pan del cielo.” Esto fue una preparación para la revelación total de Dios en la historia. El Dios Encarnado, o sea, Dios en la carne – Jesucristo – se ofreció a Sí mismo como alimento para la jornada. Esta presencia única de Jesús bajo las especies ocultas del pan y vino lo cual es “Emanuel,” que significa Dios con nosotros.

¡Dios está con nosotros bajo la forma del pan y vino para sostenernos, cambiarnos, y autorizarnos! Él es el “Maná Oculto” - Pan para la jornada para que no desmayemos mientras que vamos en camino hacia la Tierra Prometida – el Reino de Dios – El Jerusalén Celestial. No solamente nos sostiene, pero también nos autoriza a estar activos en la misión de la Iglesia. ¿Cuál es la misión? La misión es de hacer presente a Cristo en el mundo. En otras palabras, en el Maná Oculto literalmente recibimos a Jesús en Su presencia Eucarística, y lo hacemos para poder convertirnos en lo que consumimos. Debemos estar abiertos al cambio del Señor quien desea hacer efecto en nuestras vidas. La meta es decir junto con San Pablo, “No vivo yo, sino Cristo vive en mí.”

La Iglesia nos llama a que despertemos y dirijamos nuestra atención a los ocultos misterios sublimes de nuestra fe. Esto es un llamado a ser verdaderamente un pueblo Eucarístico. Ya que nos acercamos al Don Eucarístico estamos conscientes de nuestra adopción como hijos e hijas de Dios Padre, y hermanos y hermanas de Dios Hijo. Por medio del poder del Espíritu Santo tan activo en la vida de la Iglesia, el cual es el Cuerpo Místico de Cristo, adoramos a Jesús en el Santísimo Sacramento, recibimos a Jesús en la Sagrada Comunión, y nos convertimos en verdaderos discípulos conformes a la imagen de Él a quien recibimos. El Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo es en una palabra nuestra vida.

Sean inspirados por estas palabras escritas en el primer siglo por la Iglesia, hace 1,900 años por el Mártir San Justino, “Este alimento que llamamos Eucaristía, del cual nadie puede tomar solamente los que creen que las cosas que enseñamos son verdad, y que han recibido la limpieza del perdón de los pecados para el renacimiento, y quienes viven como Cristo nos enseñó. Ya que no recibimos estas cosas como un pan común o una bebida común, pero como Jesucristo nuestro Salvador quien se encarnó por medio de la palabra de Dios y tomó la forma de carne y sangre para nuestra salvación. El alimento consagrado por la palabra, oración, del cual nuestra carne y sangre son alimentados y renovados, *o sea*, la carne y sangre de Jesús encarnado.”

ORIGIN OF THE FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI

It was a humble nun in Belgium, Saint Juliana, Prioress of Mont Cornillon, who, as a result of a vision, suggested and advocated a special feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament to be celebrated on a day other than Holy Thursday. In 1230, Juliana communicated her vision to a small group of learned theologians, including the future Pope Urban IV, who established this Feast for the whole church in 1264.

Urban IV commissioned the great Dominican scholar Saint Thomas Aquinas to compose the texts of Mass and Divine Office for the new feast. One of the songs St. Thomas wrote in honor of the Eucharist contains these words:

Down in adoration falling,
Lo! the sacred Host we hail,
Lo! o'er ancient forms departing
Newer rites of grace prevail;
Faith for all defects supplying,
Where the feeble senses fail.

To the everlasting Father
And the Son Who reigns on high,
With the Holy Ghost proceeding
Forth from Each eternally,
Be salvation, honor, blessing,
Might, and endless majesty. Amen

Why do we need the Patrons of the Blessed Virgin Mary?

The Blessed Virgin asked us to keep the doors of this church open. She has no hands but ours.

The annual cost of utilities (gas, electric, water) and security alone is \$141,000. That amounts to \$2,711.54 per week. This does not include any ongoing maintenance and repair to the building and grounds, salaries, office supplies, telephone, etc.

\$1,000 is a lot of money

When one of our parishioners, Mr. Leonardo Reyes prayed about helping the parish with its expenses, he was blessed with the idea of the Patrons and how to meet a \$1,000 annual goal.

Why not break it down to a \$20 a week commitment to Our Lady?

Mr. Reyes asked himself how much he spent in a day on things like the purchase of coffee (\$2.00), breakfast or lunch pastry (\$1 each), soft drinks (\$1.00), or bottled water, candy bar (\$1.80), other snacks, fast food (\$3.99) or other items. Adding them up quickly got to an amount close to at least \$10.00 or more. A pack of cigarettes is around \$12.00 (and you were planning to quit anyway, right?). A sacrifice of one day's worth of purchased items might just do the trick.

Additionally, a request that the other working adults (perhaps adult children who do not yet belong to the parish) in the family to combine their contributions could help to fund a \$20.00 weekly donation from the family.

Over a year of 50 weeks (you get two weeks off), you will have contributed \$1,000.

How to become a Patron

Use the envelopes provided and make your donation as often as you prefer (weekly, monthly, quarterly, annually). Bring the envelope to church or mail it.

¿Por qué necesitamos a los Padrinos de la Virgen María?

La Santísima Virgen nos pidió mantener nuestras puertas abiertas. Ella no tiene como hacerlo, por eso nos lo pidió.

El costo anual de utilidades (gas, electricidad, agua) y la protección de seguridad nos cuesta un promedio de hasta \$141,000. El promedio semanal es aproximadamente \$2,711.54. Esto no incluye el mantenimiento y reparaciones adicionales en el edificio y los terrenos de la parroquia, tampoco incluye los salarios, gastos de oficina, teléfono, etc.

\$1,000 es mucho dinero.

Cuando uno de nuestros feligreses, el Sr. Leonardo Reyes oró para pedir ayuda por nuestra parroquia, él fue bendecido con la idea de los Padrinos y como satisfacer una meta anual de \$1,000.

¿Por qué no dividirlo a \$20 por semana como compromiso con nuestra Señora?

El Sr. Reyes se preguntó, cuanto se gasta el mismo cada día en cosas como comprar café (\$2.00), desayuno o almuerzo de pan dulce (\$1 c/u), refresco (\$1.00) agua embotellada, barra de chocolate, (\$1.80), y otros bocadillos o comida rápida (\$3.99) y algunas otras cosas.

El gasto sube rápido a una suma cerca de \$10.00 o más al día. Una cajetilla de cigarros cuesta alrededor de \$12.00 (Pero Ud. ya estaba planeado dejar de fumar, ¿verdad?) Un sacrificio de un día de comprar de todas estas cosas, podría ser la solución.

Además, puede hacer una colecta en casa con los adultos en su familia que ya trabajan. Tal vez, sus hijos que aun no se han registrados como feligreses en nuestra parroquia. Si la familia combina sus contribuciones, sería muy fácil juntar los \$20 semanales.

En el transcurso de 50 semanas en el año, usted ya junto y dono los \$1000.00



HOW WE PRAY AT ST. STANISLAUS KOSTKA

WE KEEP OUR DOORS OPEN ALL DAY AND ALL NIGHT:

We listen. In response to the call of the Blessed Virgin Mary we strive to create quiet refuge from the labor of life's journey where the soul is opened to the transforming power of God's ever abiding presence. The grace of the *Holy Eucharist* will assist a covenant people on its return to childlike trust in Jesus, provide healing and strength, and inspire enthusiasm for the work of life. Therefore we wish to safeguard sacred silence in this sanctuary that God's voice is heard in the deep recesses of the soul.

WE OFFER THE SACRED MYSTERIES AD ORIENTEM:

The *Sacred Mysteries* are offered as they were for nearly 2000 years. Today, while the *ordinary form* for offering the *Holy Eucharist* has the priest facing the *sacred assembly*, here we follow an ancient form of the *Holy Offering*, the priest and the people together, raising their eyes to the *East* from where the Lord will come at the end of all things.

This option for offering the *Sacred Mysteries* was nearly universally eclipsed in the aftermath of the Second Vatican Council beginning in the mid-1960s, but Pope Benedict, Cardinal Sarah, and other Church Fathers have inspired a resurgence of this ancient gesture for offering the *Liturgy of the Holy Eucharist*.

At the *Altar of Sacrifice*, the *priest* lays down his life and the *sacred assembly* does likewise. This is our mutual *fiat* – our *yes* spoken and offered in thanksgiving that the Lord receive us as a people in need of redemption. The Lord indeed comes to us with redeeming grace. Together, priest and people offer themselves in Christ and through Christ to the Father. Ours is a plea that God make all things new and keep us on the narrow, but difficult path that serves humanity even as it carries us to the homeland. Our turning *Ad Orientem* facilitates a proper response to having been fed with the *Word of God* as well as an appropriate preparation for the *Supper of the Lamb*.

WE OFFER TWO OPTIONS FOR THE RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION:

After the Second Vatican Council, standing for reception of the *Holy Eucharist* became the norm and fits the directives of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. Nonetheless, kneeling to receive Jesus in *Holy Communion* is in keeping with the enduring tradition of our ancestors. Today the option to kneel or stand rests with the individual. Likewise, the option to receive the *Holy Eucharist* on the tongue or on the hand rests with the individual.

Whichever manner we choose to receive Jesus in the *Holy Eucharist*, let us be conscious of this sacred and life sustaining encounter. Let us receive Him in grace and with gratitude, humbly and in humility.
