LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

First Sunday of Lent - 2019

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we begin the Lenten journey let us heed the summons of the Lord as read in the Book of Deuteronomy. In gratitude for God's graciousness to us we offer him the "*first fruits*" which in reality should be our very lives. The rule of life for practicing Catholics is "God first in all things". We were created by God for God.

We are reminded in the Letter of Saint Paul to the Romans that everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved. We need only believe with our hearts and not over think the *mystery of God*. God is closer and nearer to us than we are to ourselves. St. Paul assures us, "*If we believe we will not be put to shame.*" We give evidence of our belief in charity and mercy which is the second rule of life.

The Lenten season offers us an opportunity to collectively repent of our sins, restore the sacred to its proper place, and to be renewed in Christ for the purpose of witness.

The forty days Jesus spent in the desert and his encounter with Satan while there, are realities not limited to forty days, but characterize the entire journey of Jesus to Calvary and through the Paschal Mystery. As it was for him so it is for you and me. Jesus moved in and out of the desert and the devil with him. St. Paul reminds us rather poignantly, "*Our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. (Ephesians 6:12)*

The three temptations Jesus resisted are a lesson to us all.

1. The devil said: *Make the stones bread*. Jesus responded: *Man does not live on bread alone*. The Eucharistic Gift Jesus offers of himself as we make our way through this life is consecrated in the ritual sacrifice of the Mass and must be received alone and not mingled with other foods. Jesus feeds us that we not collapse. The Eucharist is spiritually potent and not only strengthens us but is a pledge to us that Jesus wishes to reproduce his life in us.
2. The devil said: *Worship me and I will give you everything – all power and glory over all kingdoms of this world*. Jesus responded: *Worship the Lord your God and him alone shall you serve*. This exchange is a reminder that Satan is "*Lord of the world that passes away*". He is the deceiver, seducer, and accuser. During the season of Lent let us put away any false idols or false gods and place ourselves anew and exclusively under the *Lordship of Jesus Christ*. He alone is the Lord of *history* and the Lord of *heaven and earth*. We renounce Satan and all his pomposity.
3. The devil quotes sacred scripture trying to entice Jesus to put God the Father to the test. Jesus responds: *You shall not put the Lord your God to the test*. For our part we must detach from the arrogance so prominent in our time. Ours is an arrogance that boasts of independence from God, an arrogance that accuses God, and an arrogance that perverts and distorts the natural and sacred order of all things. Ours must be the path of humility and trustful surrender.

The Blessed Virgin Mary, in all her apparitions, heralds the need for penance and conversion to avert catastrophes and calamities. Her call is issued in one word often repeated several times: *Penance – Penance – Penance*. Penance carries a three-fold translation: Pray, fast, and act in charity. Our response to her call and the very purpose of Lent is to nurture right relationship with God, deliverance from the wiles of the devil, and to assist others on the way.

May our observance of this penitential season stir the Lord's concern for us and spare us his reproach. Heed the words of St. Paul: *We appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. Behold, now is the acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation.*

CARTA DEL PÁRROCO

PRIMER DOMINGO DE CUARESMA - 2019

Estimados Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,

Mientras que comenzamos la jornada Cuaresmal prestemos atención al llamado del Señor como es leído en el Libro del Deuteronomio. En gratitud por la bondad de Dios con nosotros le ofrecemos nuestros “*primeros frutos*” los cuales en la realidad deben ser nuestra propia vida. Para los católicos practicantes, la ley de la vida es “Primero Dios antes de todas las cosas”. Somos creados por Dios y para Dios.

En la Carta de San Pablo a los Romanos somos recordados que todo aquel que invoca el nombre del Señor será salvo. Solamente debemos creer con nuestros corazones y no pensar tanto sobre *el misterio de Dios*. Dios está más cerca de nosotros que nosotros mismos. San Pablo nos asegura, “*Si creemos no seremos puesto en vergüenza.*” Damos evidencia de nuestra creencia en la caridad y misericordia lo cual es la segunda regla de la vida. La temporada Cuaresmal nos ofrece la oportunidad de arrepentirnos de nuestros pecados de una manera colectivamente, restaurar a su lugar propio, y ser renovados en Cristo para el propósito de ser testigos.

Los cuarenta días que pasó Jesús en el desierto y Su enfrentamiento con Satanás mientras que estaba allí, son realidades no limitadas a los cuarenta días, pero caracterizan toda la jornada de Jesús al Calvario hasta el Misterio Pascual. Así como lo fue para Él así lo será para ti y para mí. Jesús entraba y salía del desierto y el diablo detrás de Él. San Pablo nos recuerda muy claramente, “*Nuestras batallas no son contra los enemigos de sangre y carne, pero más bien contra los gobernantes, contra las autoridades, contra los poderes cósmicos de la oscuridad de este presente, contra las fuerzas espirituales del mal en los lugares del cielo.* (Efesios 6:12)

Las tres tentaciones que Jesús resistió son una enseñanza para todos nosotros.

1. El diablo dijo: *Convierte las piedras en pan.* Jesús respondió: *El hombre no sólo vive del pan.* El Don Eucarístico que Jesús ofrece de Sí mismo mientras caminamos por esta vida es consagrado en el rito sacrificial de la Misa el cual debe ser recibido sólo y no mezclado con otros alimentos. Jesús nos alimenta para que no caigamos. La Eucaristía es un potente espiritual y no solamente nos da la fuerza, pero también es un compromiso con nosotros de que Jesús desea reproducir Su vida en nosotros.
2. El diablo dijo: *Alábame y te daré todo – todo poder y Gloria sobre todos los reinos de este mundo.* Jesús respondió: *Alaba al Señor tu Dios y sólo a Él servirás.* Este intercambio es un recordatorio que Satanás es “*Señor de este mundo el cual sólo pasará*”. Él es el mentiroso, el seductor, y el acusador. Durante la temporada de la Cuaresma dejemos cualquier tipo de ídolos falsos o dioses falsos y pongámonos de nuevo exclusivamente bajo el *Reinado de Jesucristo*. Sólo Él es el Señor de la *historia* y el Señor del *cielo* y *de la tierra*. Renunciamos a Satanás y toda su pomposidad.
3. El diablo recita la sagrada escritura para tentar a Jesús para poner a Dios Padre a la prueba. Jesús responde: *No pondrás al Señor tu Dios a la prueba.* Por nuestra parte debemos despegarnos de la arrogancia tan presente en nuestro tiempo. Nuestra arrogancia presume de la independencia de Dios, una arrogancia que acusa a Dios, y una arrogancia que pervierte y distorsiona la orden natural y sagrada de todas las cosas. Nuestro camino debe ser de humildad y de una entrega llena de confianza.

La Santísima Virgen María, en todas sus apariciones, anuncia la necesidad de la penitencia y conversión para evitar catástrofes y calamidades. Su llamado es emitido en una sola palabra que es repetida varias veces: *Penitencia – Penitencia – Penitencia*. La penitencia lleva una traducción de tres partes: Oración, ayuno, y actos de caridad. Nuestra respuesta a su llamado y el mismo propósito de la Cuaresma es nutrir una buena relación con Dios, liberación de los engaños del diablo, y asistir a los demás en el camino.

Que nuestra observación de esta temporada penitencia conmueva la preocupación del Señor por nosotros y nos perdone su reproche. Presten atención a las palabras de San Pablo: Los llamamos a que no reciban la gracia de Dios en vano. *Miren, ahora es el tiempo aceptable; miren, ahora es el día de salvación.*

Prayers, Devotions, and Confession

Divine Mercy Chaplet: 3:00 p.m. – Monday thru Friday beginning March 6 through April 17

Adoration: Commit to Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament at the Monstrance Our Lady of the Sign. The church/sanctuary is open 24/7. Sign up in the vestibule.

Confessions: 5:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. – Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday. (The weeks when Fr. Anthony is in Rochester at the Mayo Clinic, confessions will be from 6:00 p.m. to 6:45 p.m. He is expected to be out the week of March 11th and the week of April 1st).

Mass: Monday through Friday at 7:00 p.m. and Saturday morning at 7:30 a.m.

Stations of the Cross: Friday evening immediately after the 7:00 p.m. Mass. (bi-lingual)

Study

Lenten Reflections: “The Eucharist” 5 session course Mondays 7:30 p.m. (after 7:00 p.m. Mass), OR Sundays 8:45 a.m. in the rectory. The sessions may be followed online beginning March 11th through April 8th. (see details in bulletin)

Penance

Fast/Abstinence: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 to 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Rite of the Church - binding on Roman Catholics from the age of 14 and older. (USCCB)

Penitencia

Ayuno/Abstinencia: el Miércoles de Ceniza y Viernes Santo son días obligatorios de ayuno y abstinencia para los católicos. También los viernes durante la Cuaresma son días obligatorios de abstinencia.

Las normas sobre el ayuno obligatorio son de la edad de 18 a 59. Cuando ayunan, una persona es permitida hacer una comida completa, al igual dos comidas pequeñas las cuales no hacen una comida completa. Las normas tocantes a la abstinencia de la carne son obligatorias para los miembros del Rito Latino de la Iglesia – son obligatorias para los Católicos Romanos de la edad de 14 en adelante. (USCCB)

HOW WE PRAY AT ST. STANISLAUS KOSTKA

WE KEEP OUR DOORS OPEN ALL DAY AND ALL NIGHT:

We listen. In response to the call of the Blessed Virgin Mary we strive to create quiet refuge from the labor of life's journey where the soul is opened to the transforming power of God's ever abiding presence. The grace of the *Holy Eucharist* will assist a covenant people on its return to childlike trust in Jesus, provide healing and strength, and inspire enthusiasm for the work of life. Therefore we wish to safeguard sacred silence in this sanctuary that God's voice is heard in the deep recesses of the soul.

WE OFFER THE SACRED MYSTERIES AD ORIENTEM:

The *Sacred Mysteries* are offered as they were for nearly 2000 years. Today, while the *ordinary form* for offering the *Holy Eucharist* has the priest facing the *sacred assembly*, here we follow an ancient form of the *Holy Offering*, the priest and the people together, raising their eyes to the *East* from where the Lord will come at the end of all things.

This option for offering the *Sacred Mysteries* was nearly universally eclipsed in the aftermath of the Second Vatican Council beginning in the mid-1960s, but Pope Benedict, Cardinal Sarah, and other Church Fathers have inspired a resurgence of this ancient gesture for offering the *Liturgy of the Holy Eucharist*.

At the *Altar of Sacrifice*, the *priest* lays down his life and the *sacred assembly* does likewise. This is our mutual *fiat* – our *yes* spoken and offered in thanksgiving that the Lord receive us as a people in need of redemption. The Lord indeed comes to us with redeeming grace. Together, priest and people offer themselves in Christ and through Christ to the Father. Ours is a plea that God make all things new and keep us on the narrow, but difficult path that serves humanity even as it carries us to the homeland. Our turning *Ad Orientem* facilitates a proper response to having been fed with the *Word of God* as well as an appropriate preparation for the *Supper of the Lamb*.

WE OFFER TWO OPTIONS FOR THE RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION:

After the Second Vatican Council, standing for reception of the *Holy Eucharist* became the norm and fits the directives of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. Nonetheless, kneeling to receive Jesus in *Holy Communion* is in keeping with the enduring tradition of our ancestors. Today the option to kneel or stand rests with the individual. Likewise, the option to receive the *Holy Eucharist* on the tongue or on the hand rests with the individual.

Whichever manner we choose to receive Jesus in the *Holy Eucharist*, let us be conscious of this sacred and life sustaining encounter. Let us receive Him in grace and with gratitude, humbly and in humility.
