LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I was at the Mayo Clinic last week undergoing tests as Hurricane Michael was ravaging the Florida Panhandle. On one hand I was anxious about the state of my health. On the other hand I was anxious about my mother and seven brothers and sisters who all live in Panama City. While two members of the family lost their homes, the rest of my family suffered to varying degrees damage to theirs. With no electricity, no means of communication, and no water, along with everyone else, they found themselves in a state of shock and in a state of survival. They were taking water from nearby swimming pools. This is no exaggeration.

Thank God everyone survived with their lives, but what once was, no longer is. I was deeply depressed seeing images of total destruction. The Air Force Base where my friends and I were altar boys and served in the Civil Air Patrol was in total ruin. Mexico Beach, where my parents would take us to swim in the Gulf of Mexico, recreate and soak in the sun, had nearly disappeared. Our neighborhoods now look as though a barrage of bombs dropped from heaven. The beautiful pine trees that adorn the whole of Bay County were either uprooted or cut in half with the ease with which you break a toothpick. It's being said it'll be fifty years before Panama City will cool itself under the shade of a tree.

The only relief from the anxiety, the depression, and the strange death I felt came through prayer. Naturally I look at all this from the perspective of faith and the mysterious design of God's providence. Reality had been painfully realized which forced me to look higher and deeper to that place where *eye has not seen nor ear heard what God has prepared for those who love Him*.

Are these disasters not perhaps a premonition of what lies ahead? The world is passing away and we with it. This is a truth we'd be hard pressed to deny. When reality hits you in the face it begs the question, is there cause for hope? Is this how it goes? Is this where it all ends?

The silver lining in the storms of our life journey is that these storms are an invitation to deeper realities that transcend the here and now of where we are. We can wallow in self-pity and shake an angry fist to the heavens or we can humbly surrender all suffering to the great Paschal Mystery of our faith. God did not spare Himself anything of what we suffer, but through the crucifixion, death, and resurrection of Jesus, assures us that all ends well for those who love God.

The real crisis of our day, in the world and in the Church, is that we've lost an appreciation of the sacrificial nature of life and have ceased showing gratitude to God who always delivers us from whatever brings us down. The crisis of faith has reached a tipping point that the only hope we have is the hidden faith of an *anawim*.

To the humble, the Blessed Virgin Mary consistently and unceasingly calls for prayer and penance for the sake of conversion and peace that the world be saved from whatever lies ahead. Are we heeding the message? Look around. Take note. What do you see? What can you do? The Holy Mother of God simply reiterates what we read today in the letter to the Hebrews: *Hold fast to the confession of faith and confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help*.

That grace and mercy be conferred, the Blessed Virgin Mary has asked that the doors of St. Stanislaus Kostka remain open. Never underestimate the power of your prayer and your presence within the doors of this sacred place. Here your prayers bring you and those for whom you pray beyond the sufferings of our present age. We may not see it in the moment, but the Spirit of God moves mysteriously and the fruit of prayer ripens in due season and due time.

CARTA DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,

Estuve en la Clínica Mayo la semana pasada bajo exámenes mientras que el Huracán Michael estaba arrasando a Florida. Por un lado, estaba ansioso sobre el estado de mi salud. Por el otro lado estaba ansioso sobre mi madre y mis siete hermanos y hermanas quienes viven en la Ciudad de Panamá. Mientras que dos miembros de la familia perdieron sus hogares, el resto de mi familia sufrió a diferentes niveles daños a los de ellos. Sin electricidad, sin fuentes de comunicación, sin agua, junto con todos los demás, se encontraron en un estado de shock y en un estado de cómo sobrevivir. Estaban cogiendo agua de las piscinas cercanas. Esto no es una exageración.

Gracias a Dios todos sobrevivieron, pero lo que algún día fue, ya no es. Yo estaba profundamente deprimido al ver las imágenes de la destrucción total. La Base de la Fuerza Aérea donde mis amigos y yo éramos acólitos y donde servíamos en la Patrulla Aérea Civil, estaba en total ruina. Playa México, donde mis padres nos llevaban a nadar en el Golfo de México, para la recreación y tomar el sol, casi se ha desaparecido. Ahora los vecindarios parecen como si múltiples bombas cayeron del cielo. Los hermosos árboles de pino que adornaban todo el Condado de Bay fueron arrancados de sus raíces o cortados a la mitad con la facilidad que se quiebra un palito. Se dice que tomarán cincuenta años para que la Ciudad de Panamá se refresque bajo la sombra de un árbol.

El único alivio de la ansiedad, la depresión, y la muerte rara que sentí llegó por medio de la oración. Naturalmente miro todo esto desde la perspectiva de la fe y el designio misterioso de la providencia de Dios. La realidad había dolorosamente sido reconocida lo cual me obligó a mirar hacia un lugar más alto y más profundo donde *ningún ojo ha visto ni ningún oído ha escuchado lo que Dios tiene preparado para aquellos que lo aman*.

¿A caso estos desastres tal vez sean una premonición de lo que viene? El mundo es pasajero y nosotros con él. Esta es una verdad que es difícil de negar. ¿Cuando la realidad nos da un golpe en la cara nos pregunta, hay una causa de esperanza? ¿Así es como van las cosas? ¿Es aquí donde se termina todo?

El rayo de luz en las tormentas de nuestra vida en jornada es que estas tormentas son una invitación a las realidades más profundas que van más allá del aquí y del ahora donde nos encontramos. Podemos arrastrarnos sintiendo lástima por nosotros mismos y sacudir con enojo el puño hacia los cielos o podemos humildemente entregar todo nuestro sufrimiento al gran Misterio Pascual de nuestra fe. Dios no se escatimó a Sí mismo de cualquier cosa que nosotros sufrimos, pero por medio de la crucifixión, muerte, y resurrección de Jesús, nos asegura que todo termina bien para aquellos que aman a Dios.

La verdadera crisis de nuestro día, en el mundo y en la Iglesia, es que hemos perdido el agradecimiento de la naturaleza del sacrificio de la vida y hemos dejado de mostrar nuestra gratitud a Dios quien siempre nos libra de todo lo que nos baja el ánimo. La crisis de la fe ha llegado a un punto que la única esperanza que tenemos es la fe oculta del *anawim (el pequeño rebaño)*.

Para los humildes, la Santísima Virgen María, constantemente y sin parar nos llama a la oración y a la penitencia por la conversión y la paz y para que el mundo sea salvo de lo que está por venir. ¿Estamos escuchando el mensaje? Miren alrededor. Tomen nota. ¿Qué ven? ¿Qué pueden hacer? La Santa Madre de Dios simplemente recalca lo que leemos hoy en la carta de los hebreos: *Mantengamos firme la profesión de nuestra fe y acerquémonos con plena confianza al trono de la gracia, para recibir misericordia, hallar la gracia y obtener ayuda en el momento oportuno*.

Que esa gracia y misericordia sean otorgados, La Santísima Virgen María ha pedido que las puertas de San Estanislao Kostka se mantengan abiertas. Nunca bajo estimen el poder de sus oraciones y su presencia dentro de las puertas de este lugar sagrado. Aquí sus oraciones les traerán a ustedes y a aquellos por los quienes han orado más allá de los sufrimientos de nuestro tiempo presente. Tal vez no lo vemos en el momento, pero el Espíritu de Dios nos mueve misteriosamente y el fruto de la oración madurará a su debido tiempo.

HEATING SYSTEM PROJECT

Dear Friends,

Thanks to your generosity and to the generosity of an anonymous donor who covered a great amount of the cost of the new boiler we were able to raise enough funds to replace the parish's entire heating system. This project allowed us to upgrade every aspect of the church and rectory heating infrastructure which had no be done in many decades. This is a major capital improvement to our parish infrastructure which positions our parish to effectively function well into the future.

We now have state-of-the-art steam boilers, along with new circulation pumps, new vacuum pumps, new feed tank, new zone valves, new thermostats, new controls, new gas burners, and the replacement of piping along with insulation in the steam tunnels that run beneath the rectory and church.

Lastly, this upgrade will lower our annual heating costs helping us toward the goal of lowering operating costs of the parish while running the facilities as efficiently as possible.

Thank you again for a successful campaign to upgrade our church and rectory heating system.

HOW WE PRAY AT ST. STANISLAUS KOSTKA

WE KEEP OUR DOORS OPEN ALL DAY AND ALL NIGHT:

We listen. In response to the call of the Blessed Virgin Mary we strive to create quiet refuge from the labor of life's journey where the soul is opened to the transforming power of God's ever abiding presence. The grace of the *Holy Eucharist* will assist a covenant people on its return to childlike trust in Jesus, provide healing and strength, and inspire enthusiasm for the work of life. Therefore we wish to safeguard sacred silence in this sanctuary that God's voice is heard in the deep recesses of the soul.

WE OFFER THE SACRED MYSTERIES AD ORIENTEM:

The *Sacred Mysteries* are offered as they were for nearly 2000 years. Today, while the *ordinary form* for offering the *Holy Eucharist* has the priest facing the *sacred assembly*, here we follow an ancient form of the *Holy Offering*, the priest and the people together, raising their eyes to the *East* from where the Lord will come at the end of all things.

This option for offering the *Sacred Mysteries* was nearly universally eclipsed in the aftermath of the Second Vatican Council beginning in the mid-1960s, but Pope Benedict, Cardinal Sarah, and other Church Fathers have inspired a resurgence of this ancient gesture for offering the *Liturgy of the Holy Eucharist*.

At the *Altar of Sacrifice*, the *priest* lays down his life and the *sacred assembly* does likewise. This is our mutual *fiat* – our *yes* spoken and offered in thanksgiving that the Lord receive us as a people in need of redemption. The Lord indeed comes to us with redeeming grace. Together, priest and people offer themselves in Christ and through Christ to the Father. Ours is a plea that God make all things new and keep us on the narrow, but difficult path that serves humanity even as it carries us to the homeland. Our turning *Ad Orientem* facilitates a proper response to having been fed with the *Word of God* as well as an appropriate preparation for the *Supper of the Lamb*.

WE OFFER TWO OPTIONS FOR THE RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION:

After the Second Vatican Council, standing for reception of the *Holy Eucharist* became the norm and fits the directives of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. Nonetheless, kneeling to receive Jesus in *Holy Communion* is in keeping with the enduring tradition of our ancestors. Today the option to kneel or stand rests with the individual. Likewise, the option to receive the *Holy Eucharist* on the tongue or on the hand rests with the individual.

Whichever manner we choose to receive Jesus in the *Holy Eucharist*, let us be conscious of this sacred and life sustaining encounter. Let us receive Him in grace and with gratitude, humbly and in humility.

We save money because we have 1 priest serving entire parish in 3 languages, share operations director 50% of time with another parish, have only 2 full-time staff (pastor/secretary), do not have any maintenance staff.
