LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday we welcome, honor, and bless those who serve us as police officers, firefighters, paramedics, and first responders. We want them to know that their profession is respected, needed, and that they are valuable and indispensable to us. We are not blind to who they are and what they do for us. As Christians we recognize Jesus serving us through them.

Today's gospel shows us a blind man in need of eyes that see. The blind man cried out, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me," but the people rebuked the blind man and basically told him to *shut up*. The blind man would not be silenced. He called out all the more and Jesus went to his aid.

Unlike the blind man we have eyes, but there are things we struggle to see. At times are we are blinded by a barrage of filth around us and in us that like the blind man we find ourselves crying to have our eyes opened. We long to see something or someone who can rid us of the filth – something or someone to clean it up. We feel the toxicity around us and in us. It can be blinding. We can't see our way out so we cry for someone to bring us some semblance of sanity and civility – some peace, yet the poison just seems all the more to shout us into blindness.

Is it not for this reason we gather together in sacred assembly? Perhaps we really don't know why we've come. Could it be that like the blind man in the gospel, there is a cry welling up from the deep recesses of the soul, *have pity on me – save me – help me – heal me – open my eyes?* In spite of the rude noise of the world trying to shout our cries into silence, Jesus hears us. He wishes to open our eyes.

Like the blind man in the gospel, all we really want is to see. We can deal with the inevitable trials and tribulations that are simply the reality that comes with life in *exile* as we move toward the *homeland*, but we are tired of being blind. We want to see some semblance of sanity – some semblance of civility – some semblance of serenity.

Last week we read in the letter to the Hebrews, *Let us confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help*. The *altar of sacrifice* is the *throne of grace*. Here the Lord opens our eyes to His compassion and empathy as His *salvific offering* is renewed. It is a reminder that Jesus spared Himself nothing of what we suffer and remains with us as He sends us into the filth and toxicity of the world to fight the good fight, but not alone. He opens our eyes to show us He is with us.

This is a fight not only for sanity, civility, and serenity, but indeed we fight for salvation – the salvation of our world, the salvation of our nation, the salvation of our neighborhoods, the salvation of our families and friends. The *altar of sacrifice* is the *throne of grace – the throne of our salvation* – here our eyes are opened anew and grace is conferred that the toxicity of the world not blind us.

We began the month of October with the consecration of our lives to the Blessed Virgin Mary and the blessing of our rosaries. Let us commit to praying the rosary that our eyes remain open to all that is sacred – all that is true, beautiful, and good in us and around us. And speaking of good, the service of police officers, firefighters, paramedics, and first responders is a good we cannot do without.

So today we offer them the Rosary, a weapon – a remedy – a sacramental – as a source of strength and a shield of protection in their sacrificial struggle to safeguard and defend all that is right and good in their commitment to life – to law and to order. May it be the chain that binds them to almighty God, a reminder that His eyes are ever upon them, and that they have a mother, solicitous in her care for them. Police officers, firefighters, paramedics, and first responders remind us that Jesus is indeed with us to open our eyes to some sense of sanity, some semblance of civility, and this brings us sure serenity.

CARTA DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,

Este domingo le damos la bienvenida, honramos, y pedimos bendiciones sobre aquellos que nos sirven como policías, bomberos, paramédicos, y primeros respondedores. Queremos que sepan que su profesión es respetada, necesaria, y que son valorizados e indispensables para nosotros. No somos ciegos a quienes son ellos y lo que hacen por nosotros. Como cristianos reconocemos que Jesús nos está sirviendo a través de ellos.

El evangelio de hoy nos muestra que el ciego necesitaba ojos para ver. El ciego gritó, “Jesús, hijo de David, ten compasión de mí,” pero la gente lo reprendían y básicamente le decían que se *callara*. Él gritó aún más fuerte y Jesús fue a su auxilio.

A diferencia del ciego tenemos ojos, pero hay cosas que nos cuestan ver. A veces somos cegados por la cantidad de basura alrededor de nosotros y dentro de nosotros que igual que el ciego nos encontramos gritando para que nuestros ojos sean abiertos. Añoramos ver algo o alguien que nos pueda liberar de la basura – algo o alguien que la limpie. Sentimos la toxicidad alrededor de nosotros y dentro de nosotros. Puede segarnos. No podemos ver la salida y por lo tanto gritamos para que alguien nos traiga una poca de cordura y civilidad – un poco de paz, sin embargo, el veneno parece ser que más y más nos grita llevándonos a nuestra ceguera.

¿No es por esta razón que nos reunimos en esta asamblea sagrada? Tal vez no sabemos por qué hemos venido. ¿Puede ser que al igual que el ciego en el evangelio, hay un grito brotando dentro de lo más profundo de nuestra alma, *ten piedad de mí – sálvame – ayúdame – sáname – abre mis ojos?* A pesar del bullicio del mundo tratando de silenciar nuestros gritos, Jesús nos escucha. Él desea abrir nuestros ojos.

Como el ciego en el evangelio, lo que realmente queremos es ver. Podemos lidiar con las pruebas inevitables y las tribulaciones que son simplemente la realidad que son parte de la vida del *exilio* mientras caminamos hacia la patria, pero estamos cansados de estar ciegos. Queremos ver un poco de cordura – un poco de civilidad – un poco de serenidad.

La semana pasada leímos en la carta a los hebreos, *Lleguemos con confianza al trono de gracia para recibir misericordia y encontrar gracia para el auxilio en el debido momento*. El *altar de sacrificio* es el *trono de gracia*. Aquí el Señor abre nuestros ojos a Su compasión y empatía a Su *ofrecimiento de salvación* lo cual es renovado. Es un recordatorio que Jesús no se escatimo a si mismo de nada de lo que nosotros sufrimos y permanece con nosotros mientras nos manda hacia la basura y la toxicidad del mundo para dar la buena pelea, pero no solos. Él nos abre nuestros ojos para mostrarnos que Él está con nosotros.

Esta es una batalla no solamente por la cordura, la civilidad, y por la serenidad, pero verdaderamente peleamos por la salvación – la salvación de nuestro mundo, la salvación de nuestra nación, la salvación de nuestros vecindarios, la salvación de nuestras familias y amistades. El *altar de sacrificio* es el *trono de gracia – el trono de nuestra salvación* – aquí nuestros ojos son abiertos de nuevo y la gracia es otorgada para que la toxicidad del mundo no nos ciegue.

Comenzamos el mes de octubre con la consagración de nuestras vidas a la Santísima Virgen María y la bendición de los rosarios. Comprometámonos a rezar el Rosario para que así nuestros ojos permanezcan abiertos a todo lo que es sagrado – todo lo que es verdadero, hermoso, y bueno en nosotros y alrededor de nosotros. Hablando de lo bueno, el servicio de los policías, los bomberos, los paramédicos, los primeros respondedores es un bien con no podemos estar sin él.

Por lo tanto, hoy les ofrecemos el Rosario, un arma – un remedio – un sacramental – una fuente de fuerza y un escudo de protección en su batalla de sacrificio para proteger y defender todo lo que es correcto y bueno en su compromiso a la vida – a la ley y la orden. Que pueda ser la cadena que nos ata a Dios todopoderoso, un recordatorio que Sus ojos están fijos sobre de ellos y que tienen una madre, solicita en su cuidado de ellos. Policías, bomberos, paramédicos, y primeros respondedores nos recuerdan que Jesús está verdaderamente con nosotros para abrir nuestros ojos a una poca de cordura, una poca de civilidad, y esto nos trae una serenidad segura.

HEATING SYSTEM PROJECT

Dear Friends,

Thanks to your generosity and to the generosity of an anonymous donor who covered a great amount of the cost of the new boiler we were able to raise enough funds to replace the parish's entire heating system. This project allowed us to upgrade every aspect of the church and rectory heating infrastructure which had no be done in many decades. This is a major capital improvement to our parish infrastructure which positions our parish to effectively function well into the future.

We now have state-of-the-art steam boilers, along with new circulation pumps, new vacuum pumps, new feed tank, new zone valves, new thermostats, new controls, new gas burners, and the replacement of piping along with insulation in the steam tunnels that run beneath the rectory and church.

Lastly, this upgrade will lower our annual heating costs helping us toward the goal of lowering operating costs of the parish while running the facilities as efficiently as possible.

Thank you again for a successful campaign to upgrade our church and rectory heating system.

HOW WE PRAY AT ST. STANISLAUS KOSTKA

WE KEEP OUR DOORS OPEN ALL DAY AND ALL NIGHT:

We listen. In response to the call of the Blessed Virgin Mary we strive to create quiet refuge from the labor of life's journey where the soul is opened to the transforming power of God's ever abiding presence. The grace of the *Holy Eucharist* will assist a covenant people on its return to childlike trust in Jesus, provide healing and strength, and inspire enthusiasm for the work of life. Therefore we wish to safeguard sacred silence in this sanctuary that God's voice is heard in the deep recesses of the soul.

WE OFFER THE SACRED MYSTERIES AD ORIENTEM:

The *Sacred Mysteries* are offered as they were for nearly 2000 years. Today, while the *ordinary form* for offering the *Holy Eucharist* has the priest facing the *sacred assembly*, here we follow an ancient form of the *Holy Offering*, the priest and the people together, raising their eyes to the *East* from where the Lord will come at the end of all things.

This option for offering the *Sacred Mysteries* was nearly universally eclipsed in the aftermath of the Second Vatican Council beginning in the mid-1960s, but Pope Benedict, Cardinal Sarah, and other Church Fathers have inspired a resurgence of this ancient gesture for offering the *Liturgy of the Holy Eucharist*.

At the *Altar of Sacrifice*, the *priest* lays down his life and the *sacred assembly* does likewise. This is our mutual *fiat* – our *yes* spoken and offered in thanksgiving that the Lord receive us as a people in need of redemption. The Lord indeed comes to us with redeeming grace. Together, priest and people offer themselves in Christ and through Christ to the Father. Ours is a plea that God make all things new and keep us on the narrow, but difficult path that serves humanity even as it carries us to the homeland. Our turning *Ad Orientem* facilitates a proper response to having been fed with the *Word of God* as well as an appropriate preparation for the *Supper of the Lamb*.

WE OFFER TWO OPTIONS FOR THE RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION:

After the Second Vatican Council, standing for reception of the *Holy Eucharist* became the norm and fits the directives of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. Nonetheless, kneeling to receive Jesus in *Holy Communion* is in keeping with the enduring tradition of our ancestors. Today the option to kneel or stand rests with the individual. Likewise, the option to receive the *Holy Eucharist* on the tongue or on the hand rests with the individual.

Whichever manner we choose to receive Jesus in the *Holy Eucharist*, let us be conscious of this sacred and life sustaining encounter. Let us receive Him in grace and with gratitude, humbly and in humility.

We save money because we have 1 priest serving entire parish in 3 languages, share operations director 50% of time with another parish, have only 2 full-time staff (pastor/secretary), do not have any maintenance staff. Church cleaning/maintenance done volunteered.
