LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today's gospel opens with the apostle John perplexed that those not in the *inner circle* were casting out demons in the name of Jesus. Jesus said, *let it be*. Those driving out the demons, while not named among the apostles, were actively involved in the work of God. This should be a clarion call to Catholics who love the faith and have quietly endured a diabolical assault to those things they hold sacred.

The laity are not bishops, priests, or deacons, but they are indispensable to the cleansing of the Church. Principally speaking, we should all uphold life, marriage and family, as well as the clergy and the sacred liturgy as inviolable to the health and salvation of a civil and religious society. All of us, priests and people, have been affected by the spiritual and moral upheaval of the Judeo/Christian world view – a world view dangerously dismissed. If the clergy do not honestly and deeply address the forces perpetuating the moral and spiritual decline of our age the laity must take action.

Those who hold to innocence and simplicity in the faith have been victimized, scandalized, and/or corrupted by the more powerful and arrogant who have lost a good sense of Christian identity and are suffering a seeming loss of faith. In today's gospel Jesus speaks His strongest words in defense of the innocent, "*Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were drowned into the sea.*" With this in mind we would be hard-pressed to deny the veracity of the prophetic messages of the Blessed Virgin Mary unfolding in real time in our time.

In the 17th century the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to Venerable Mother Marianna de Jesus Torres in Quito, Ecuador. In these Church approved apparitions, Our Lady offered a timeline of events that was quite specific. She said that shortly after the middle of the 20th century passions will erupt and there will be a total collapse of customs that will principally affect children. She said the Sacrament of Marriage will suffer with iniquitous laws that will destroy the sanctity of the family and that the Catholic spirit will rapidly decay; the precious light of faith will gradually be extinguished until there will be an almost total and general corruption of customs.

Of priests, the Blessed Virgin Mary said, "*The priests will be ridiculed, oppressed and despised. The Devil will persecute the priests in every possible way. He will labor with cruel and subtle astuteness to deviate the priests from the spirit of their vocation and will corrupt many of them. These depraved priests will scandalize the Christian people, will make the hatred of bad Catholics and the enemies of the Church fall upon all priests.*"

Further in these unhappy times; there will be unbridled luxury which will ensnare the rest into sin and conquer innumerable frivolous souls who will be lost. Innocence will almost no longer be found in children, nor modesty in women. The vices of impurity, blasphemy, and sacrilege will dominate in this time of depravity.

The Blessed Virgin Mary said, a simple and humble faith in the truth of her apparitions will be reserved for the humble and fervent who are docile to the inspirations of grace and that our Heavenly Father communicates His secrets to the simple of heart, and not to those whose hearts are inflated with pride, pretending to know what they do not.

To the faithful the Blessed Mother said, *Pray insistently without tiring and weep with bitter tears in the secrecy of your heart, imploring our Celestial Father that, for love of the Eucharistic Heart of my Most Holy Son and His Precious Blood shed with such generosity and by the profound bitterness and sufferings of His cruel Passion and Death, He might take pity on His priests and quickly bring to an end those ominous times...*"

Do not dismiss these messages as mere fantasies of the fanatical. They are consistent with the prophetic themes of Sacred Scripture, the teachings of the Church, and the words of the Saints through the ages.

Yes, today's gospel finds the apostle John perplexed as he saw those not in the *inner circle* driving out demons in the name of Jesus. He complained to Jesus who simply replied, *Let it be. They are with us.*

Do not underestimate the grace you have to drive out the demons of our age. Our Lady said, pray the rosary for conversion and peace. Pray for the Holy Father, bishops and priests. Pray for marriage and family. Pray for the young. Pray that life be welcomed, cherished, and protected. Pray that faith be accepted and lived to the full. Let your voices be heard.

CARTA DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,

En Evangelio de hoy comienza con el apóstol Juan confundido que aquellos que no eran parte del círculo interno estaban expulsando los demonios en nombre de Jesús. Jesús le dijo, déjalos. Aquellos expulsando a los demonios, aún sin ser nombrados entre los apóstoles, estaban activamente envueltos en el trabajo de Dios. Esto debe ser un llamado claro a los católicos quienes aman la fe y en el silencio han soportado el asalto diabólico a las cosas sagradas que ellos llevan.

Los laicos no son obispos, sacerdotes, o diáconos, pero son indispensable a la limpieza de la Iglesia. Principalmente, todos debemos defender la vida, el matrimonio y familia, al igual el clérigo y la sagrada liturgia inviolable a la salud y salvación de una sociedad religiosa civil. Todos nosotros, sacerdotes y pueblo, hemos sido afectados por la convulsión espiritual y moral de la cosmovisión cristiana/judía – una cosmovisión peligrosamente descartada. Si el clérigo no habla honestamente sobre las fuerzas perpetuando la declinación moral y espiritual de nuestro siglo los laicos necesitan tomar acción.

Aquellos que se abrazan de la inocencia y la sencillez en su fe han sido victimizados, escandalizados, y o corrompidos por los más poderosos y arrogantes que han perdido el buen sentido de la identidad y están sufriendo y perdiendo la fe. En el Evangelio de hoy Jesús habla con palabras fuertes en defensa de los inocentes, *“quien sea la causa de que estos pequeños que creen en mi a que pequen, sería mejor que una piedra grande sea amarrada alrededor de su cuello y sea ahogado en el mar.”* Con esto en mente estaríamos en un apuro negar la verdad en los mensajes proféticos de la Santísima Virgen María los cuales van desarrollando en nuestro tiempo.

En el siglo 17 la Santísima Virgen María se le apareció a la Venerable Madre Marianna de Jesús Torres en Quito, Ecuador. En estas apariciones aprobadas, Nuestra Señora ofreció una serie de eventos cuyos eran específicos. Dijo que un poco después a mediados del siglo 20 las pasiones estallarían y que habría la caída de costumbres las cuales afectarían a los niños. Dijo que el Sacramento del Matrimonio sufriría con leyes injustas que destruirían la santidad de la familia y que el espíritu católico se deterioraría rápidamente; la luz preciosa de la fe poco a poco se apagaría hasta que haiga casi por completo una total corrupción general de las costumbres.

Sobre los sacerdotes, la Santísima Virgen María dijo, *“Los sacerdotes serán mofados, oprimidos, y odiados. El Demonio acosará a los sacerdotes de cada manera posible. El trabajará con astucia cruel y sutil para descarrilar a los sacerdotes del espíritu de su vocación y corromperá a muchos. Estos sacerdotes depravados escandalizaran al pueblo cristiano, hará que el odio de los católicos malos y los enemigos de la Iglesia caiga sobre todos los sacerdotes.”*

Más adelante en estos tiempos infelices; habrá lujos desenfrenados que entramparán a los demás a que pequen y conquistarán una multitud de almas frívolas que se perderán. La inocencia casi no existirá en los niños, ni la modestia en las mujeres. Los vicios de impureza, blasfemia, y sacrilegio dominarán en este tiempo de depravación.

La Santísima Virgen María dijo, la fe sencilla y humilde sobre la verdad de sus apariciones será reservada para los humildes y los fervorosos quienes son dóciles a las inspiraciones de gracia y que nuestro Padre Celestial comunicará Sus secretos a los de corazón simple, y no aquellos cuyos corazones están inflados con orgullo, fingiendo que saben lo que no saben.

La Santísima Madre dijo a los files, *Oren incesantemente sin cansancio y lloren lágrimas de dolor en el secreto de su corazón, implorando a nuestro Padre Celestial que, por amor al Corazón Eucarístico de mi Santísimo Hijo y Su Preciosísima Sangre derramada con tanta generosidad y por el profundo dolor y sufrimientos de Su cruel Pasión y Muerte, Él pueda tomar piedad sobre Sus sacerdotes y rápidamente traer a su fin estos tiempos siniestros...”*

No descarten estos mensajes como simple fantasías o fanatismo. Son consistentes con los temas proféticos de las Sagradas Escrituras, las enseñanzas de la Iglesia, y las palabras de los Santos durante los siglos.

Sí, el evangelio encuentra al apóstol Juan confundido al ver a los que no eran del *círculo interno* expulsando a los demonios en nombre de Jesús. Él se quejó con Jesús quien simplemente le respondió, *Déjalos. Ellos están con nosotros.*

No bajo estimen la gracia que tienen de expulsar a los demonios de nuestro siglo. Nuestra Señora dijo, recen el Rosario por la conversión y paz. Recen por el Santo Padre, obispos y sacerdotes. Recen por el matrimonio y familia. Recen por los jóvenes. Recen para que la vida sea bienvenida, valorada, y protegida. Recen para que la fe sea aceptada y vivida por completo. Permitan que sus voces sean escuchadas.

HOW WE PRAY AT ST. STANISLAUS KOSTKA

WE KEEP OUR DOORS OPEN ALL DAY AND ALL NIGHT:

We listen. In response to the call of the Blessed Virgin Mary we strive to create quiet refuge from the labor of life's journey where the soul is opened to the transforming power of God's ever abiding presence. The grace of the *Holy Eucharist* will assist a covenant people on its return to childlike trust in Jesus, provide healing and strength, and inspire enthusiasm for the work of life. Therefore we wish to safeguard sacred silence in this sanctuary that God's voice is heard in the deep recesses of the soul.

WE OFFER THE SACRED MYSTERIES AD ORIENTEM:

The *Sacred Mysteries* are offered as they were for nearly 2000 years. Today, while the *ordinary form* for offering the *Holy Eucharist* has the priest facing the *sacred assembly*, here we follow an ancient form of the *Holy Offering*, the priest and the people together, raising their eyes to the *East* from where the Lord will come at the end of all things.

This option for offering the *Sacred Mysteries* was nearly universally eclipsed in the aftermath of the Second Vatican Council beginning in the mid-1960s, but Pope Benedict, Cardinal Sarah, and other Church Fathers have inspired a resurgence of this ancient gesture for offering the *Liturgy of the Holy Eucharist*.

At the *Altar of Sacrifice*, the *priest* lays down his life and the *sacred assembly* does likewise. This is our mutual *fiat* – our *yes* spoken and offered in thanksgiving that the Lord receive us as a people in need of redemption. The Lord indeed comes to us with redeeming grace. Together, priest and people offer themselves in Christ and through Christ to the Father. Ours is a plea that God make all things new and keep us on the narrow, but difficult path that serves humanity even as it carries us to the homeland. Our turning *Ad Orientem* facilitates a proper response to having been fed with the *Word of God* as well as an appropriate preparation for the *Supper of the Lamb*.

WE OFFER TWO OPTIONS FOR THE RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION:

After the Second Vatican Council, standing for reception of the *Holy Eucharist* became the norm and fits the directives of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. Nonetheless, kneeling to receive Jesus in *Holy Communion* is in keeping with the enduring tradition of our ancestors. Today the option to kneel or stand rests with the individual. Likewise, the option to receive the *Holy Eucharist* on the tongue or on the hand rests with the individual.

Whichever manner we choose to receive Jesus in the *Holy Eucharist*, let us be conscious of this sacred and life sustaining encounter. Let us receive Him in grace and with gratitude, humbly and in humility.
